JOHN ARKINSTALL STATE TEAMS 2020 SYDNEY METROPOLITAN ZONE

CLUB QUALIFYING SUPPLEMENTARY TOURNAMENT REGULATIONS

- 1. The State Open Teams Championship is conducted under the Laws of Duplicate Bridge 2017 and the Tournament Regulations of the New South Wales Bridge Association, as amended.
- 2. Qualification for the Final Series is divided into 5 zones:
 - The Sydney Metropolitan Zone qualifies 2 teams to the Final Series via the Metropolitan Final.
 - The Country Teams Championship qualifies 6 teams to the Final Series, two from each of the Northern, Southern & Western, and Outer Metropolitan Zones.
 - The NSWBA Qualifying event qualifies 2 teams to the Final Series.
- 3. Club qualifying events may be run as teams or IMP-scored pairs competition, over a maximum of **six** sessions. Clubs may run two separate qualifying events, provided each caters to different members (*e.g.* one is played during the day and the other at night or on a weekend).
- 4. Yellow Systems are not permitted in club qualifying events nor the Metropolitan Final. Pairs wishing to play a yellow system in the State Final must notify the Chairman of the NSWBA Tournament Committee tournament@nswba.com.au of their intent at least 1 week prior to the start of the State Final. This notification must be accompanied by a copy of the system and a suggested defence for the opponents.
- 5. Players do not have to be members of the club at which the qualifying competition is held, but must be resident in the Sydney Metropolitan area, or play a significant amount of bridge at one or more clubs located in the Sydney Metropolitan area.
- 6. Directors must be qualified at Club level (Grade D) or above.
- 7. If running a pairs event, Butler Pairs with match lengths of at least 5 boards should be preferred. A normal pairs movement with rounds of 2, 3 or 4 boards and employing IMP scoring is permissible, but will result in many fewer masterpoints being issued, and these only to the top half of the field. Matchpoint scoring is not permitted.
- 8. Qualification to the Metropolitan Final
 - 8.1 All teams participating in a club qualifying event are eligible to represent that club in the Metropolitan Final, provided they are *bona fide* competing teams. This means that each team must have entered and played the club qualifying event as a team it is not allowable for players who have qualified in different teams to play together in the Final as club representatives, but see Clause 8.2 below.
 - 8.2 Teams may augment players at any time prior to Friday 6th November, *i.e.* either before or after the Metropolitan Final. Augmented players must be members of the club conducting the qualifying event. Permission to augment after 6th November may be granted by the NSWBA Tournament Committee in exceptional circumstances.
 - 8.3 If holding a Butler Pairs qualifying event, any 2 or 3 participating pairs may join together to form a team.
 - 8.4 Entries will be accepted into the Metropolitan Final from teams that are not representing an affiliated club. The entry fee for such teams is \$160 per team.
 - 8.5 Clubs may hold club qualifying events and award red masterpoints without having to send any representative teams to the Metropolitan Final.

9. Subsequent stages

- 9.1 The Metropolitan Final will be held at the NSWBA on Sunday 25 October 2020.
- 9.2 The State Finals will be held at the NSWBA Friday 13 Sunday 15 November 2020.

10. Masterpoints

- 10.1 Red masterpoints will be awarded at State Championship (level B). Red masterpoints are to be calculated on a weighting of 5.0. The event is run under the NSWBA's grade B (State Championship) allowance do not use your club's B4c sessions.
- 10.2 Red masterpoints are awarded on a sessional basis only; *i.e.* there is NO outright award. If a club runs a qualifying session(s), followed by a final and consolation, only the players in the final will receive red masterpoints. Green masterpoints may be awarded to these players as for a normal club session, through the standard monthly upload.
- 10.3 The red masterpoints awarded are not to be entered on the club's quarterly or monthly return to the ABF Masterpoint Centre, but must instead be emailed to the Organiser as a .red file. They must **not** be sent to the State Masterpoint Secretary nor the ABF Masterpoint Centre.

11. Administration

- 11.1 An Excel file to assist hosting clubs is available for download from the NSWBA website http://www.nswba.com.au/tourn/state/se.asp?Y=2020&E=sotmetro. This is to be completed and used as a cover sheet and check list. At the end of the qualifying event (and before Monday 12th October) the club needs to send the following to the Organiser by email:
 - The format of the event, including the number of boards played in each match, the number of rounds played, and the number of teams (or pairs) in the event.
 - The completed Excel coversheet available from the NSWBA website (see above).
 - A complete copy of the results as pdf, text, html, Word or Excel files. This must include a list of all teams and their members and the number of matches they won, drew and lost.
 - Masterpoint information as a .red file, sent as an email attachment.
 - A complete list of team members (*i.e.* names and ABF numbers) of teams that will proceed to the Metropolitan Final.
- 11.2 The NSWBA will send an invoice to cover the masterpoint costs and the team entry fees after the conclusion of the Metropolitan Final. Do not send any money until you receive the invoice.
 - Masterpoint costs in 2020 are calculated at \$1.28 per masterpoint.
 - Entry fees are \$80 per team.
- 12. Timetable. Clubs should note the following dates:
